<p><u>Suggested Activity:</u></p> <p>Resources Link: https://www.kapowprimary.com/subjects/french/upper-key-stage-2/year-5/french-speaking-world/lesson-1-directions-in-french/</p> <p>Introduce the words for the directions in French – don't tell them which is which, show the compass on the slides. Can the children match them up?</p> <p>Then show the slide with the intermediate compass points – can the children guess how to combine the words to make these points?</p> <p>Play the compass points game. Call out a direction, children use their arms to show which it is.</p> <p>Children create compass spinner activity – you need split pins.</p>	<p><u>Suggested Activity:</u></p> <p>Resources Link: https://www.kapowprimary.com/subjects/french/upper-key-stage-2/year-5/french-speaking-world/lesson-1-directions-in-french/</p> <p>Remind them of the compass points. Play the treasure map game.</p> <p>Wrapping up – label each wall with a direction. Ask a volunteer 'pirate' to stand at the front of the class and close their eyes. Hide 'treasure' under one child's seat. The pirate then opens their eyes and chooses children to direct them to the treasure.
