

Attendance and Absences

If your child is absent from school, it is your responsibility to contact the school to let us know. This can be done by calling the office on 01472 357982 or emailing the office at office@smp.nelcmail.co.uk or by messaging on the ScholarPack app.

Please do not message on Dojo.

If your child is absent and we do not hear from you by one of the methods above, you will receive a phone call to ask the reason for the absence. If you do not respond to the phone call, then a home visit could be made. If we do not receive an acceptable reason for the absence, then it will be recorded as unauthorised. Unauthorised absences are reported to the Education Welfare officer and could result in a penalty notice.

Pick Up

We ask that parents wait behind the cones which are placed at the bottom of the school playground. Staff will only release their child once they have seen the nominated parent/carer or person whose name appears on the permissions to take home form. Children will come out in their classes and will line up and will be dismissed accordingly. If someone turns up to collect a child who is not on the nominated list, the child will not be released to that person.


Please could parents, when collecting their children, not block the Church entrance, car park or the drive located on Heneage Road.



Road Safety

All parents,

This is a reminder from the Road Safety Team, after reports of dangerous and illegal parking from certain parents at St. Mary's School. All signage and markings are enforceable outside the school and we have scheduled regular visits from the Civil Enforcement Officers to monitor the area and may issue Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) to parents parked in contravention of the markings. These restrictions are in place for the SAFETY OF ALL CHILDREN/PARENTS at your school.

1. The Single Yellow Line near the school indicates that drivers must not wait in these areas and are much the same as a double yellow line except they only apply during certain times. The hours of operation of the Single Yellow Line restrictions in this area are Monday to Friday 8am-6pm. Drivers are allowed to stop on Single Yellow Lines to drop off or pick up passengers however, this should only be where the driver feels it is safe to do so and the vehicle should only be stopped for as long as it takes to get the passenger in or out of the vehicle. If parents wish to accompany their child into school, we strongly advise they park in a location that is not subject to any parking restrictions, in order to avoid receiving a Penalty Charge Notice.

We thank all parents who comply with current restrictions and would like to take the opportunity to remind all drivers to park legally, safely and with consideration for local residents who live in the area. As you aware the Road Safety team and St. Mary's School will work closely together to ensure the safety of pupils going to and from school and we want this to continue successfully.

What we have been up to at St Marys

In RE this term, **Nursery** children visited the chapel to see where people can come to celebrate.







Our topic this half term in **Reception** is 'Dangerous Dinosaurs!'. Within this topic, we will investigate pre-historic animals, extinction and the planet as it was 65 million years ago! We will discuss and compare similarities and differences between pre-historic creatures and animals that roam the Earth today. Children will be inspired to join in and use language to describe and identify dinosaurs. They will do this through investigating fossils and footprints. Through stories such as 'Worrysaurus' children will express and talk about their feelings. They will investigate what dinosaurs ate and develop understanding of past and present times.














This term **Year 1** we are looking at special people. Mr O'Connor came to talk to us all about why we are so special. We have also looked at who is in the parish family and their different roles. We had the chance to use our acting skills to, and we retold the story of the Presentation.









In Design & Technology this term **Year 1** are also exploring mechanisms. The children will have lots of chances to explore axles, chassis and wheels and looks at what types work best.








In Science, this term we are exploring humans and animals. So far we have looked at our different body parts and explored the 5 senses. This included having fun using our sense of touch to help us identify objects. We have now moved onto looking at the six different animal groups. In Maths this term **Year 1** are looking at addition and subtraction within 20. We started off the topic by making our own number lines on the tables! The children thought this was great fun!









Also in **Year 1** Geography our topic is about our local area. We have been looking at where Grimsby is in the United Kingdom and then we have gone on to explore the differences between human and physical features.








In **Year 2** Science, we have been exploring animal survival and their habitats. Children first identified what animals/objects are living, once alive and never alive.





In **Year 2** - To launch our new Geography topic, 'Grimsby and beyond,' children made their own trawlers to decorate our classroom. We have also been on a guided walk around Grimsby looking at the different parts of our town and using our fieldwork and observational skills to identify old and new parts of Grimsby.

In **Year 3** P. E - we have been doing gymnastics and practising our balance skills. Our Geography topic is volcanoes and earthquakes. Children helped to make an ash cloud and the core of our volcano for our display. In Art we have been learning all about pop art and practicing our painting technique just like Andy Warhol. In our Science lessons, we have been learning all about rocks and made a model of sedimentary rocks using different coloured dough.












