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Attendance - Absences

If you are planning to take your child out of school for any reason other than a medical appointment that cannot be arranged out of school time, please contact the school office to fill in a request for leave form.

If you fill one of these forms in, then the decision can be made whether the absence is authorised or unauthorised.

If you fail to fill a form in with enough notice, then the absence will be unauthorised. Unauthorised absences are reported to the Education Welfare Officer and a fine could be issued.

End of day Routine



Gates will open at 3.15 p.m. for the end of the school learning day at 3.20 p.m. Parents must line up behind the cones on the playground. Staff will lead out classes and line up on the playground to dismiss children individually. No child will be dismissed to anybody who is not on the nominated list. They will not be dismissed to a minor (if a sibling is collecting them, then they must be at secondary school and be on the nominated list).

No adult will be allowed to call a child to come to them or take a child from the line. The teacher must dismiss.

- Permissions to take home need to be updated for the PE teacher / teacher leading the club.




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Celebration of the children's work.








Year 2 - Using concrete resources to help understand different ways to partition numbers.
