Christingle

'Christingle' means 'Christ Child' and originates from the Moravian Church. A symbol of Christianity, Christingles are made from an orange decorated with red tape, sweets or dried fruit and a candle. Each of these different elements has a special meaning:

The orange symbolises the world.

The red ribbon shows God's love for the world and the blood of Jesus.

The sweets/dried fruit represent God's creations.

The four cocktail sticks can represent either the four seasons or the four corners of the world.

The candle represents Jesus being the light of the world, bringing hope to those in darkness.

The history of Christingles goes back to over 300 years ago, when in Germany, Bishop Johannes de Watteville gave all the children a candle with a red ribbon around it to explain the happiness that people feel through knowing Jesus.

Begins on Christmas day and ends on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Christmas is a season, not a day. This is difficult to realise since the world wants to 'get back to normal' long before we have arrived at the last day of Christmas: The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.
