Geography – Australia (Great Barrier Reef)

In this exciting comparative study, the children will learn about the water cycle and how it moves around the Earth. We will focus on Great Barrier Reef (marine biome) and analyse the impact of climate change on the coral reef. We will take part in a coral workshop at 'The Deep' aquarium in Hull and observe coral reef and some of the species of the Great barrier Reef in captivity.

Maths

We will continue to work on fractions, understanding mixed numbers and improper fractions will begin the module. We will then learn how to convert fractions using number lines. We will use fraction families to help us solve problems using addition and subtraction.

Following on , our second module is Decimals. We will use tenths as decimals to solve problems. Place value charts and division will play a key role in this module.

English - Writing

Children will create a narrative based on a story from other cultures. They will then move on and learn how to and write a persuasive letter.

English - Reading

Reading discussion lessons will be based on the text 'The Girl Who Stole An Elephant' by Nizrana Farook. Reading skills lessons will include a range of skill- based tasks and VIPER style questions.
