**Compete** – for young people who are competitive in nature and enjoy competing against others.





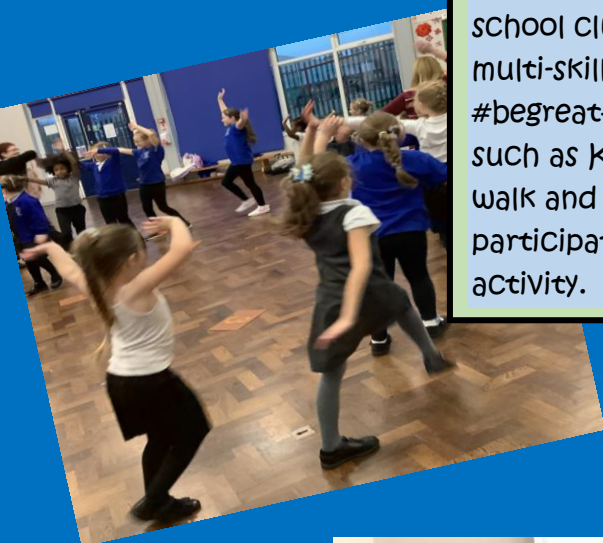


## PHYSICAL LITERACY
