#### Warmer Weather

With the warmer weather arriving please apply sun cream to your child before they come into school. Please also send your child in with a hat with their name clearly marked on it. The children will be on the school field for break and lunch times. For Nursery and Reception only, you can send in your child's sun cream, this must have their name on it. We have plenty of shaded areas for your child to enjoy, and we always ensure water is available. The office does not hold or keep any sun cream. – Thank you

#### ParentPay and Arbor – Important Announcement.

Mealselector (used for ordering meals) will be closing down in the next couple of weeks. Parent/carers will be able to order free school meals or pay for meals via ParentPay. These changes will benefit your child as you will be able to update any information via ParentPay about allergies and intolerances etc. This is also a reminder to order meals for your child's day back on 4<sup>th</sup> September. Orders need to be put in 2 weeks' prior of returning to school. If missed you will need to supply packed lunches once orders have been placed.

#### Arbor APP

Also just a reminder to download the schools Arbor App. You can check your child's attendance, update any information and soon be able to use it for payments. Please check emails especially junk folder as logins details will be sent via email.







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#### Free School Meals

As you may be aware when your child moves into year 3 in September they will no longer be entitled to a free school meal under the Universal Free School meal scheme.

If your child currently has school meals, there will be 3 options for you from September 2024.

- 1. You can send your child with their own packed lunch each day.
- 2. You can pay for your child to have a school meal through the app ParentPay.
- 3. If you are entitled to Benefit Free School meals you can continue to order meals through ParentPay just select the free school meal option.

If you are unsure if you are entitled to free school meals please pop to the school office to fill out a form, we will scan it and send it to the council for you. Although September seems a long way away, applications for free school meals do take a bit of time to process so the earlier you apply the better. This will also give us time to let the caterers know that your child is entitled to Free School Meals so they have you recorded in their system for when you order.

#### Free Milk

Free Milk does end when your child is 5 years old unless your child is receiving Benefit Free School Meals. If you wish for your child to continue having milk at school and would like to pay for this, please visit coolmilk.com

Year 2 children learnt about Queen Victoria, one of Britain's significant monarchs. They have written a biography of her life and in the following lesson will learn in more detail why she was significant and the impact her reign had on Britain.









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Our <u>Year 3</u> class in English have been learning preservative writing this Pentecost Term. Preservative wiring is a form of non-fiction writing and the writer can use authoritative, emotional, factual and logical arguments to persuade the reader. Well Done Year 3.







In Year 4, students visited the Hands on History museum in Hull where the children participated in an Ancient Egypt workshop, followed by some time to explore the exhibits and enjoy lunch. After that, Year 4 took a short walk to the Hull and East Riding Museum of Archaeology to explore. What an exciting day we all had.







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In History, <u>Year 5</u> have been learning about-enslaved Africans and the transportation that took place to benefit countries.

First, we learned about the Portuguese sailors and how they used the enslaved Africans for their knowledge of crop plantation and farming. To further our understanding, we learned about the triangular slave trade over the Atlantic, which involved Europe, America, the Caribbean and Africa.





As part of our science topic on classification, <u>Year 6</u> took part in a Forest School's session. We started the lesson by playing a boundaries game, which enabled us to understand the perimeters.

We then collaborated to make the shapes that Mrs Ballard presented to us; this became difficult when we were tapped on the shoulder to say we had to shut our eyes and others were not allowed to speak.

Next, we were shown how to make the timber hitch knot. We used our Sammy the snake story to remember the sequence.

We also enjoyed hot chocolate, hot dogs and onions, for our hard work.
